Early Head Start Adaptation

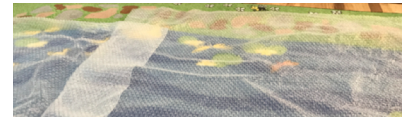
Children will explore bubble wrap and astonishing air!

Materials will vary depending on classroom but include:

Bubble wrap

Try This!

- Place sheets of bubble wrap on the ground and allow children to crawl across it, poke it, or step on it!
- Encourage children to find different ways to pop the bubbles!



Science Process Skills

- Exploration
- Observations
- Categorizing

Classroom Implementation

While children are exploring you can model open-ended questions by asking:

- What does it sound like?
- What shapes do you see?
- What does this remind you of?

Depending on the age of the children, how it is presented will look different. This is a very open ended, exploration activity. Keeping that in mind, here are some suggestions:

- Have children play with the bubbles without popping them! Explore how the air moves around when you press on it.
- Talk about how different the bubbles look when they are popped.
- Experiment with building or rolling balls on the bubble wrap.
- Paint the bubble wrap!
- Infants can explore by crawling on bubble wrap.
