Children will categorize and sort a variety of objects in to many different groups to help them build connections of the world around them.

Materials

A variety of plastic animals

Try This!

Provide children with a variety of plastic animals

Let children decide how they would like to sort the animals, and then let them start making groups.

Classroom Implementation

While children are exploring you can model open-ended questions by asking:

What types	of groups are you	making?
vviiat types	or groups are you	manna.

- ☐ What differences do you notice? What is the same?
- ☐ Could we make another group?
- ☐ What other things in this room could we sort?



Depending on the age of the children, how it is presented will look different. This is a very open ended, exploration activity. Keeping that in mind, here are some suggestions:

Challenge children to first create 1 category that unites all animals, followed by 2, 3
and 4 different categories.

□ Place the animals in a sensory area to explore and participate in dramatic play

□ Place the animals in different containers to make different noisemakers and maybe even try to sort the noise makers by type of animal that children predict are inside.
