“Nigel Nose-It-All” takes guest on an interactive tour of how the nose functions with allergies, sinuses, and runny noses. Mimic the build-up of acid indigestion by causing the “Burp Man” to release a giant belch. Explore the role of the kidney in a virtual reality experience in “Urine: The Game.” Discover the many features of human skin, including pimples, warts, hair, moles, and other blemishes while traversing a 12’ long fiberglass skin wall. At “Patients Please!” guests learn their body parts through a large-scale game of Operation®. See what the nose really knows while playing the scent-matching game “Y U Stink.”

Grossology is a collaboration between Science World, Advanced Exhibits, and Grossology author Sylvia Branzei. As a teacher, writer, curriculum designer and microbiologist, Branzei explains the concept of Grossology as a learning tool. “This is science in disguise,” she says. “If we teach students in their own words, they’ll understand better and actually learn something.”
