Main Functions:

<u>Early Childhood Programming</u>: Delivers science-process programs for preschool audiences at the museum and offsite.

<u>Educator Professional Development</u>: Assists with the set-up and delivery of teacher professional development for preschool educators, including Head Start.

<u>Parent/Caregiver and Family Programming</u>: Assists with the set-up and delivery of workshops for parents/caregivers and families.

<u>Afterschool Programming</u>: Leads afterschool enrichment programs at local elementary schools.

Event Support. Assists with special events and outreach initiatives, as needed.

Participates as project team member and collaborates with staff from Education and other departments on special projects.
